III. Hospital Management Model(s)

Describe the hospital management model in your country:

The majority of healthcare is provided by

- major central hospital in Reykjavík (Landspítali)
- a smaller hospital in Akureyri (Sjúkrahúsið á Akureyri)
- Primary Healthcare of the Capital Area (Heilsugæsla höfuðborgarsvæðisins)
- 6 regional healthcare institutions, each with primary care, secondary care and to varying degrees nursing homes and other services.

Private and independent (but government-funded) institutions provide nursing home care, specialised rehabilitation and other healthcare.

Describe the model of hiring / appointment of Healthcare managers / Hospital directors / CEOs:

Government-run institutions are headed by CEOs appointed by the minister of health for 5 years at a time.

Composition and model of appointment of the Board of Directors:

There is no board of directors. However a board of executives is hired/appointed by CEO of each institution.
